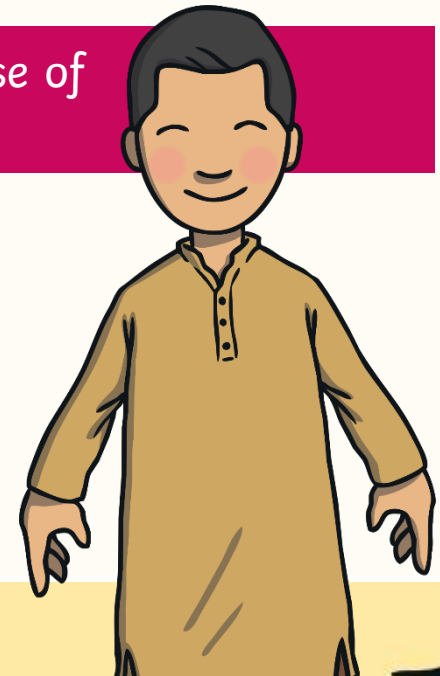

What Is a Pilgrimage?

The people who go on these special journeys are called 'pilgrims'.

River Ganges and Varanasi

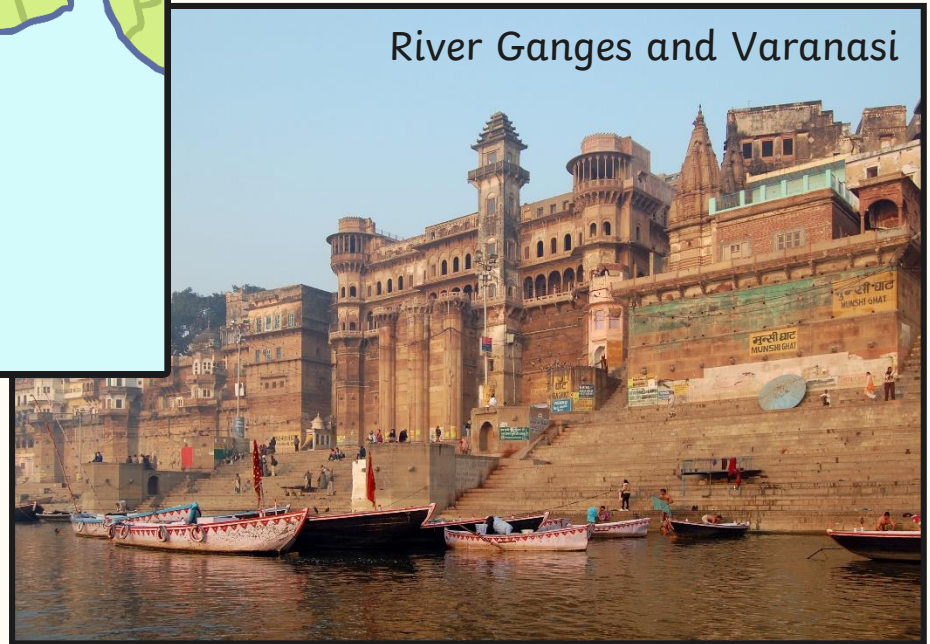

- Varanasi is on the banks of the sacred River Ganges.
- People travel to the river to bathe in it.
- It is believed that washing in the river cleans a person's sins.
- Varanasi is believed to be the home of Lord Shiva, a Hindu god.

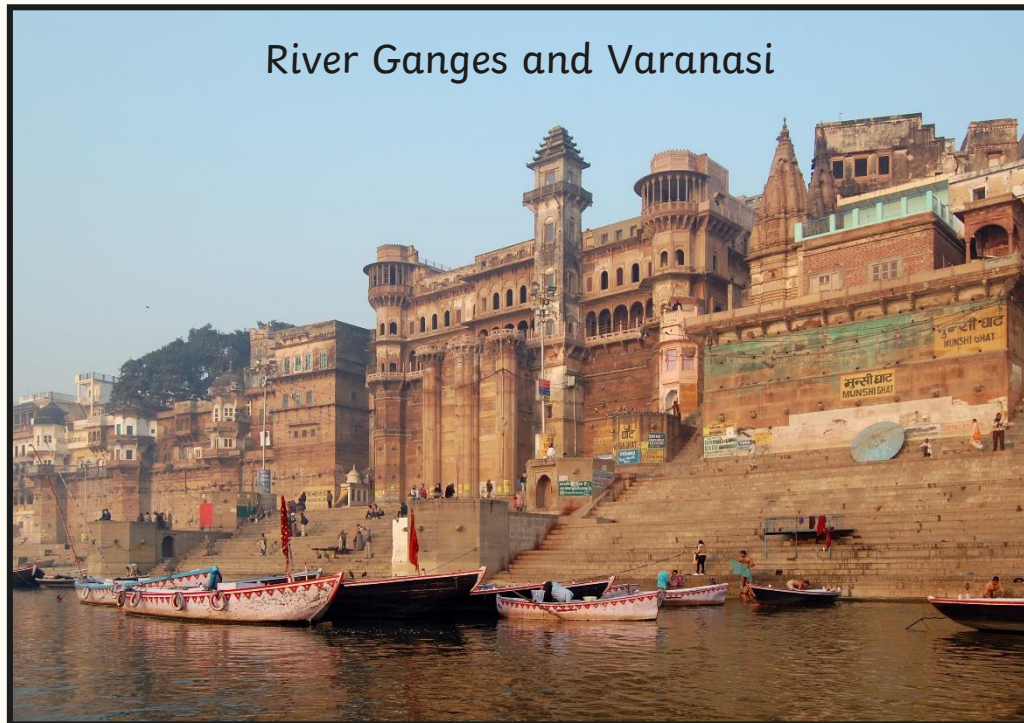

River Ganges

- The River Ganges is in India.
- It is very special for Hindus.
- 40 million Hindus travel to the Ganges on a pilgrimage every year.
- Hindus believe that performing special rituals for the dead in the Ganges will end the cycle of birth, death and rebirth.
- Hindus offer gifts of flowers, petals and special floating candles to the river to say thank you.



We believe that bathing in the waters of the River Ganges will wash away our sins.

Varanasi

- Varanasi is a city on the banks of the River Ganges.
- Varanasi is said to have been founded by Shiva.
- Hindus believe that is a very holy site.
- There are 23,000 Hindu temples in Varanasi.
- Hindus bathe in the waters of the Ganges on the banks of Varanasi.

Hindus believe in three main gods; Shiva, Brahma and Vishnu.

Shiva is believed to have founded Varanasi after a battle with Brahma.



Special Places

Once every 12 years, millions of people bathe at the Kumbh Mela festival where the waters of the Ganges and Jumna combine.

Hindus come from all over the world, believing that bathing will wash away their sins.
