# SUMMER 2024

#### **Curriculum**

Below is an outline of what we will be covering during the Summer term:

English	In Literacy we will be learning <i>Handa's Surprise</i> by Eileen Brown, <i>The Very Hungry Caterpillar</i> by Eric Carle and reading non-fiction texts about animals. We are also going to make our own fact files and booklets on how to care for these creatures!
Phonics and Reading	Phonics (both reading and writing words and sentences) is taught every morning. During the Summer term, the children will work on writing full sentences and consolidating their knowledge of Set 1 and Set 2 sounds. <b>Please ensure that you</b> <b>hear your child read every day and update their Reading Record.</b>
Maths	This term we are focusing on numbers beyond 10. We will develop children's understanding of how to carry on counting and thinking about what number comes next. We will further explore addition and subtraction, and learn about sharing and grouping numbers.
RE	In RE we will ask the question "How Did Jesus 'Rescue' People?". We will learn six Bible stories which demonstrate the Christian belief that Jesus came to save (or 'rescue') people. In the second half of term we will ask "Who Made the Wonderful World?" and discuss what Christians believe about creation and the natural world!
Topic	Our topic this half term is <b>Amazing Animals.</b> The children will look after baby chicks and caterpillars and learn about life cycles. We will read lots of stories about animals and learn about the features of non-fiction texts. Then, we will have a go at writing our own fact file about animals!
	In the second half of term, our topic will be <b>Under the Sea</b> . We will read books about sea creatures, and visit the Horniman Museum Aquarium in July!
Values	We will be focusing on the whole school values of <b>Responsibility</b> and <b>Faith</b> . We will be exploring these values throughout this term and children will have the opportunity to learn how these values can be displayed, referring to examples from Bible stories and influential figures.

### Key Reminders

## <u>PE</u>

Please note that the children must bring the correct PE kit (plain navy blue/black jogging bottoms, plain white t-shirt and plain black plimsolls/trainers) to every PE lesson. Our PE coach, Mr Tientcheu, will lead the children in the PE curriculum alongside their teacher. **PE lessons will be on Wednesdays.** 

### <u>Jewellery</u>

We advise that the children do not wear **any** jewellery to school although plain stud earrings are acceptable.

### <u>Clothing</u>

Please make sure that all of your child's items of clothing are clearly labelled with their names. This applies to all items of school uniform, PE kit and coats. School shoes should be plain and black.

### Home Learning

Home learning will be set on Friday and should be handed in on Tuesday. In addition to the home learning set, your child should be reading their phonics book every day. There is a clear expectation that every child fully completes their home learning every week and we will be keeping a record of all home learning completed and contacting parents where this is not the case.

### <u>Reading</u>

It is vital that your child reads to you every day. Please complete their reading journal and ensure that they bring it into school **daily**. Your child will be given books, which we will aim to change on a weekly basis. If you have any concerns or would like some support with this, then please contact the school.
