- Practise subitising - looking at numbers and say how many

- Practise counting teddies and dinosaurs, saying number names in correct sequence
- Make arrangements and pictures with wooden shapes
- Use positional language, like behind, between, in front of
- Make simple repeating patterns with natural materials

- Autumn and Harvest activities

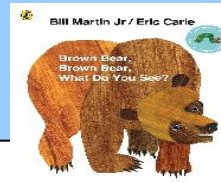
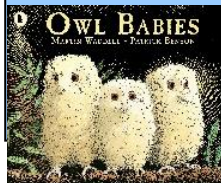

Literacy

- Phase 1 Phonics - Tuning into sounds, going on a sound walk, making sounds with percussion instruments
- Listening & Attention games

Physical Development

- Exploring the different construction sets, such as the marble run
- Negotiating obstacle courses and travelling along the climbing equipment
- Improving our ball skills

- To develop a comfortable pencil grip when writing and drawing
